Signs and **symptoms** of nappy rash

Nappy rash is a very common skin condition for babies in their early years. It can happen at any time while a baby is wearing nappies, however it is particularly common when baby is weening or teething.

- Nappy rash is a skin irritation where skin under the nappy becomes red and sore
- You might also see some lesions or spots
- Some babies may cry or be more irritable than usual as they feel uncomfortable



Care tip

Reassure parents that nappy rash is very common and most babies will have it at some point.

How to treat

Treating nappy rash

Nappy rash is easily soothed and treated with Drapolene® Cream. Its unique combination of antiseptic ingredients soothes and moisturises the skin, reducing the redness and helping to prevent infection.

- Apply a thin layer to the irritated area
- Change the baby's nappy frequently, reapplying Drapolene® Cream at every nappy change

Preventing nappy rash

Drapolene® Cream is licensed to both prevent and treat nappy rash in babies. All healthcare professionals are in agreement that it is better to have measures in place to prevent nappy rash. Here are some tips you can give parents to help them prevent their baby from getting nappy rash:


- Have a good cleaning routine for the baby: ideally use clean lukewarm water and cotton wool to clean baby's bottom and genitals at every nappy change
- Bathe the baby regularly, although this does not have to be everyday. You may choose instead to wash their face, neck, hands and bottom carefully, this is often called "topping" and "tailing"*
- Apply a thin layer of Drapolene® Cream; this non-greasy cream is gentle enough to use on the most sensitive of skin, will not clog the nappy or the nappy liner and is licensed to help prevent nappy rash if used at every nappy change
- Change the baby's nappy frequently; several times a day is recommended



What's in **Drapolene® Cream?**

Drapolene® Cream is a non-greasy, antiseptic, emollient cream. It is easy to apply and does not clog the nappy.

Other uses of Drapolene® Cream

Adult urinary dermatitis

Often associated with incontinence in older adults. Urinary dermatitis presents as itching or inflammation of the skin, caused by contact with an irritant such as urine or stools, which can cause skin damage and inflammation around the bottom or genital areas.

Drapolene® Cream is used to treat and prevent adult urinary dermatitis. The active ingredients soothe irritated or inflamed skin. Meanwhile the cream forms a clear, protective barrier over the skin to help prevent the condition.

Apply **Drapolene® Cream** to the affected area regularly after each toilet visit to effectively treat, soothe and protect the skin.

Minor burns Minor burns can be treated with Drapolene® Cream to relieve and soothe the skin and

and soothe the skin and prevent infection.

Apply a thin layer to the affected area when it is clean and dry.



Care tip

Burns can sometimes blister. Do not attempt to burst any blisters that may appear.

Drapolene® Cream's active ingredients are Benzalkonium chloride 0.01% w/w & Cetrimide 0.2% w/w. Uses: Drapolene® Cream is indicated for the relief of nappy rash and for use as an adjunct to baby care hygiene for the prevention of nappy rash. Drapolene® Cream is indicated for the relief of urinary dermatitis in adults and as an adjunct to patient care hygiene for the prevention of urinary dermatitis. Drapolene® Cream is also indicated for the symptomatic relief of minor burns, limited sunburn and the effects of weather. Side Effects: Allergic hypersensitivity reactions may occur in individuals who are sensitive to one or several components of Drapolene® Cream. Contraindications: It is inadvisable to apply Drapolene® Cream to a baby or adult who has an established hypersensitivity to benzalkonium chloride, cetrimide or lanolin. Use should be discontinued if an allergic hypersensitivity reaction is suspected. Directions: Babies: The skin under the nappy should be washed then dried thoroughly at each nappy change. Drapolene® Cream should be applied, paying particular attention to folds in the skin. Adults: The affected area (or the area of application) should be washed and dried thoroughly before applying Drapolene® Cream. Regular routine application is advised.
